

Makerspace's 2024 STEAM Discovery Festival was held Saturday, April 20th, at the Solano Community College in Fairfield. [Note: "STEAM," as used here, is not referring to the product of boiling water. It stands for "Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Mathematics."]

Accompanied by a throbbing rock music background, BAEM members enjoyed a beautiful spring day showing model engines to a crowd composed largely of families with younger kids. We had a comfortable outside booth and were able to demonstrate running engines whenever we desired. There was a lot of causal interest from the crowd, but not the kind of deep appreciation that we experience when showing to a more mechanically sophisticated audience, such as GGLS members or Good Guys gearheads.

FIRST POPS


No first pops at last month's meeting.

Charlie Reiter brought in an impressive Steam Donkey project. It featured an operating boiler driving a Stuart vertical 10 steam engine which powered a function winch. Charlie noted that Steam Donkeys were used as late as the 1920s to pull logs and drive jack hammers. Donkeys were mounted on sleds and could drag themselves to the operating locations.




Lower portion of Hansen Vertical




Head of Hansen Vertical

Peter's Duesenberg 4 cylinder has been an ongoing project. He had the water pump mounted and new drive belts operating to connect the crank to the overhead cam shafts.



Peter's Duesenberg 4 cylinder



Peter also showed his Merlin V12. He had mounted an instrument panel on the Merlin V12 engine stand. The panel base was welded to the engine mount after bending a cold rolled steel tube to provide the inclined panel mount.

Breadboard to develop circuitry to provide 400 Hz three-phase power

Somehow Perter acquired a Sperry aircraft artificial horizon of uncertain vintage. He concluded that the instrument needed 400 Hz three phase electrical power. He was unable to find a suitable power supply and is undertaking development of a battery-operated shop-made supply. Peter reported that he had the digital portion working but was having difficulty with the analog components which provide the three-phase timing. Larry Zurbrick offered to help with the analog design.

Peter also described his very creative approach to creating ball bearing races for the gyroscope mount. He used slightly oversize ball bearings pressed into a drill rod cup spun on his lathe to make the races.

Since aircraft utilizing the Merlin engine most likely used vacuum to spin artificial horizon and directional gyros, it is not altogether clear why Peter is pursuing an electrically powered device in conjunction with his Merlin project. The technical depth and breadth of Peter's engineering prowess and machining skills, however, continue to amaze fellow club members.
